- •Only Neighborhood Associations, CIDs, or BIDs may apply
- Minimum of 3 blocks in length and streets must be contagious
- Greater than 75 percent of the parking spaces are occupied
- Must get over 50% support from property owners and residents
- Approval from Mobile GR Commission and City commission








Mobile GR Study Area


